

The Creed is one of Church's earliest doctrinal statements:


It has shaped orthodox Christian belief for over 2000 years. It was not influenced in any way by a response to heresy. It was not influenced by politics like some of the later creeds.

The Creed is sacramental:



I believe in God, the Father almighty, Creator of heaven and earth. I believe in Jesus Christ, God's only Son, our Lord, Who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, Born of the Virgin Mary, Suffered under Pontius Pilate, Was crucified, died, and was buried; He descended to the dead. On the third day he rose again; He ascended into heaven, He is seated at the right hand of the Father, And He will come again to judge the living and the dead. I believe in the Holy Spirit, The holy Christian church, The communion of saints, The forgiveness of sins, The resurrection of the body, And the life everlasting. AMEN.





THE SON of MAN CAMEI D SEEK THE LOSTLUKE 19:10








On the third day He rose again from the dead; He ascended into Heaven and is seated at the right hand of God the Father Almighty; From there He will come to judge the living and the dead.
